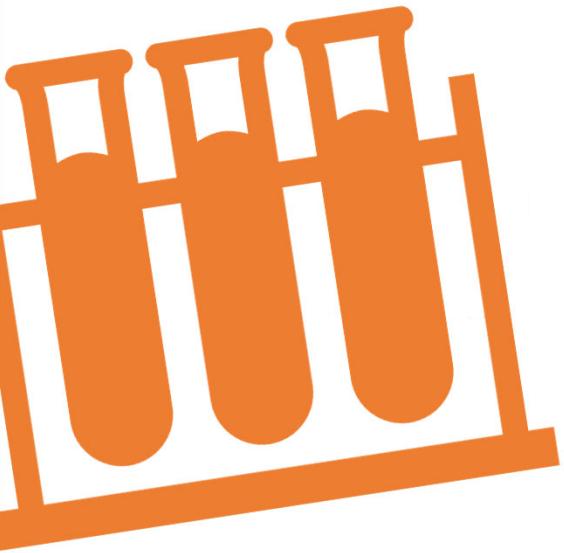

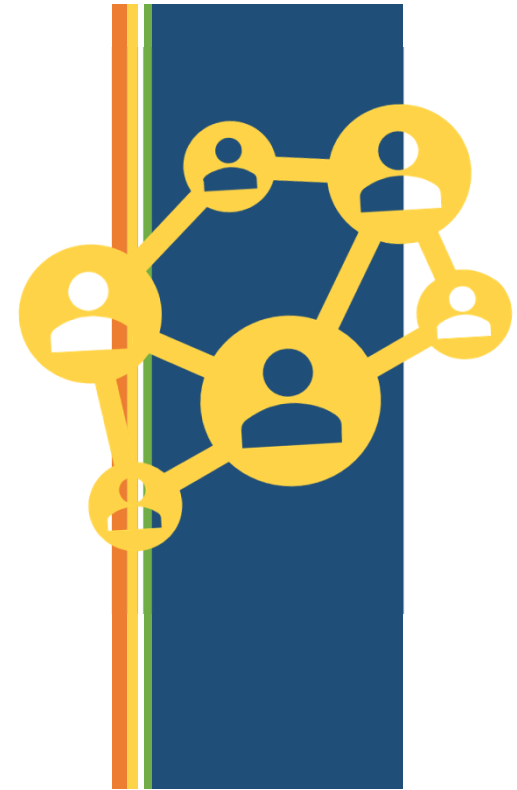

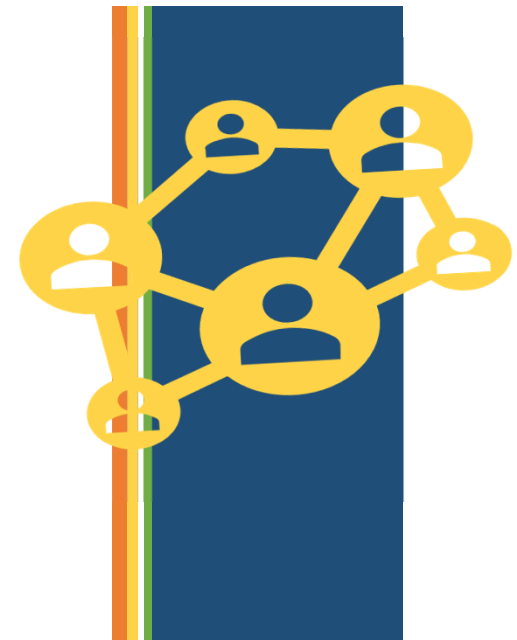
What is Family Engagement?
